## Student Responsibilities:

A nine-week syllabus/calendar will be given to you at the beginning of each grading period. **Use it.**  
*The syllabus is subject to change at the teacher's discretion, it is also available on my website.*

Homework is assigned each day in class and covers the lesson for that given day. Worksheets will be handed out in class, but are also available on my website. Students are expected to have each assignment completed in its entirety and ready for submission the following class period. Assignments turned in after the due date will be consider late.

Students are expected to have all of their supplies with them each day. Lesson notes are posted on my website and it is encouraged that the students print a copy for class use. **If you know that you will be absent, you are responsible both for communicating this to the instructor and being prepared upon your return to class.**

Each student is responsible to be prepared for the scheduled tests. Test reviews are handed out prior to the test and will also be available on my web site. A partner quiz is given the class before each test. **If a student is absent on the day of the quiz/review, he/she is still required to take the exam as scheduled. Failure to print out a review or get a copy from the instructor is not an excuse to request a make-up exam.**

## Assignments and Grading:

Before each major exam, we will have an in-class major quiz which will cover the topics of the current unit. Students will be allowed to work with a partner, as this allows an opportunity for students to learn from each other. This is also an opportunity to get a preview for the types of problems that they will see on the major test.

**Test reviews are handed out in class before every major test**, and will contain a set of practice problems to help prepare for each exam. Each test review counts as a homework grade and is due on the day of the test. No credit is given for late test reviews.

The grading policy as per McNeil guidelines is, 60% homework and quizzes, 40% tests.

Due to concerns regarding scholastic integrity, it is departmental policy that **major tests may not be taken home.** Graded exams may be reviewed in class, or before/after school.

***Homework Policy***

- Late homework can be turned in for a maximum of a 75 up until the day of the Unit Test. All assignments are required to be completed and submitted in the event of a request for retesting.

***Course Retest Policy***

In order to re-test on an exam a student must complete **ALL** of the following:

- Complete the review (all work must be shown)
- Attend at least one tutorial session to go over the failed test
- Have all homework completed and submitted prior to retesting

Timeline for re-test of an exam:

- Retest must be completed no later than 5 school days after the assessment score has been posted to HAC for a grade no greater than a 75. Retests may be scheduled before school at 7:30 AM. (Multiple tutorial opportunities will be available before due date.)

Student is absent the day of the test:

- Student will be allowed 2 days to make up test from the day they get back to campus; students who do not meet this requirement will earn a grade of 0 and are allowed to take the retest for up to a maximum grade of a 75.
- **If a student is absent on the day of the quiz/review, he/she is still required to take the exam as scheduled.**
